## **Stress Run!**

A Leisurely Game of Movement to Instruct and Entertain

## **Rules of Play**

- Place your tokens on the square marked **The Campus**.
- Players take turns clockwise to throw the dice and move their tokens. The first player to reach **The Library** wins the game!
- Roll the dice and move your token to the <u>nearest square</u> with a phrase with the **stress pattern** that matches your **dice roll**.

- Let the player to your right check if your move was correct by referring to the **Cheat Sheet**. If it was wrong, go back to your previous square.
- If you roll a six, the player to your right draws a Challenge Card and asks you a question. If you answer correctly, you gain a boost!
- If there are no more phrases with the stress pattern you rolled ahead of you, move one square forward.
